Place: The Westin Washington Dulles Airport Hotel will be the headquarters for Reunion 2016.

The hotel has 314 spacious, smoke-free rooms. High-speed internet access is free for Starwood Preferred Guests. There is a link on the hotel website to become a member. Internet access is \$9.95/day for non-members. Self- parking is free. Valet parking is \$10/day.

Amenities include: complimentary hot breakfast (buffet or order from menu), in-room safe, coffee maker, mini-refrigerator, cable TV with 37 inch flat screen, work space, hair dryer, iron and board.

The Westin Washington Dulles also has an indoor heated pool and whirlpool, a business center, and a fitness studio.

Cut-off date for reserving rooms in our block is 5 p.m. local on 21 July 2016.

Rates are good for 2 days before and after reunion. Prices include 12% tax and breakfast.

The hotel has nearly 100% occupancy in September.

Hotel Check-In: The check in time is 3:00 PM or later. Unless the hotel is full the night before, some rooms may be available a little earlier in the afternoon.

Weather: Mid September temperatures range from the mid 60's at night to the mid 80's during the day, with over 3 inches of rain during the month.

Ground Transportation

Hotel is 1 mile from the Dulles airport. Complimentary Hotel Shuttle to and from Dulles: Pickup from Dulles to hotel is from Arrival Curb 2A and 2H (near ground transportation) on the :15 & :45 of each hour on the lower level outside baggage claim. Verify you are boarding the Westin Washington Dulles Shuttle. There are other Westin properties in the area. Please call hotel at 703-793-3366 to arrange/confirm a pickup.

Complimentary Hotel Shuttle service is also provided to the Wiehle-Reston East Metro Station and to Reston Center (outdoor mall with restaurants, shops, and theater).

Reunion Registration: Register for the reunion by mailing your completed form and check made out to the C-7A Caribou Association to Pat Hanavan, 12402 Winding Branch, San Antonio, TX 78230-2770. Upon arrival, pick up your name tag and registration packet in the War Room.

If you do not pre-register, every effort will be made to accommodate last minute arrivals, but we cannot guarantee the availability of an activity due to varying prior-notice requirements.

Reunion check-in is from 1400-2100 in the War Room. For those who arrive later, find the War Room and someone will take care of you. If you arrive before noon, come on in and help us set up!

Reception: In the War Room, from 1800-2000 – our usual snacks, supplemented with a few *hors d'oeuvres* from hotel catering.

The reception is not the evening meal. Be considerate of others and take only an appropriate serving of items for yourself to make sure that everyone gets their share.

The **War Room** will be set with tables to sit around and catch up with old acquaintances. It will open at 3:00 PM on 7 September and close at midnight, and then be available from 7:00 AM to midnight on Thursday through Saturday, and from 7:00 AM until 10:00 AM on Sunday.

Exception:

During periods when reunion attendees are away, e.g., tours, the War Room will be closed (locked up) unless an Association volunteer agrees to act as War Room monitor. The Caribou Association – not the hotel – will be responsible for War Room security throughout the reunion.

Air Force Memorial

The Air Force Memorial is a place of pride and honor for all the men and women who served and continue to serve the United States Air Force and its predecessor organizations: the Aeronautical Division, U.S. Signal Corps; the Aviation Section, U.S. Signal Corps; the Division of Military Aeronautics, Secretary of War; the Army Air Service; the U.S. Army Air Forces. More than 54,000 Airmen have died in combat while serving in the Air Force or its preceding historical air services.



The Air Force Memorial design symbolizes flight and the flying spirit with 3 stainless steel spires that soar 270 feet high, representing contrails of the *Thunderbirds* in their "bomb burst" maneuver.

The USAF "star" is embedded in granite beneath the spires. There is a Runway to Glory at the entrance, an 8 foot tall bronze Honor Guard statue, 2 granite inscription walls, and a Glass Contemplation Wall.

Udvar-Hazy Center

The Udvar-Hazy Center is the companion facility to the Air & Space Museum on the National Mall. Opened in 2003, its two huge hangars, the Boeing Aviation Hangar and the James S. McDonnell Space Hangar, display thousands of aviation and space artifacts including the Boeing B-29 *Enola Gay*, an SR-71, an Air France Concorde, Gemini VII spacecraft, space shuttle *Discovery*, and numerous aircraft from WW II, Korea, and Vietnam eras to include P-38, P-40, P-51, F-86, MiG 21, F-4, and F-105D.

The Center features an IMAX® Theater and the Donald D. Engen Observation Tower, which provides a 360-degree bird's-eye view of Washington Dulles International Airport and the surrounding area. Udvar-Hazy Center is also home to the Mary Baker Engen Restoration Hangar where preservation of the National Air and Space Museum's collections takes place. A glassed-in mezzanine provides a view of restoration projects in progress.

The National Mall

The National Mall, a National Park, is an expansive, open park in the middle of Washington, D.C. that is home to numerous museums and galleries. All museums on the National Mall proper, except the National Gallery of Art, are part of the Smithsonian Institution.

Vietnam Memorial

The Vietnam Veterans Memorial is a national memorial that honors U.S. service members who fought in the Vietnam War, service members who died in Vietnam/Southeast Asia, and those who were unaccounted for (Missing In Action) during the War.

The memorial currently consists of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall (the best-known part), the Three Servicemen Memorial, the Vietnam Women's Memorial.

When a visitor looks upon the wall, his or her reflection can be seen simultaneously with the engraved names – symbolically bring-



ing the past and present together. As of May 2015, there are 58,307 names, including 8 women. Approximately 1,200 are MIA.

Directories are located on nearby podiums so that visitors may locate specific names. A list of our fallen C-7A brothers will be included in your registration packet.

Caribou Bowl

In the War Room on Saturday from 0900-1000, teams of 6 (recommend 2 ladies on each team) will compete in the 5th Caribou version of the G.E. College Bowl of the 60's. Questions will be based on T.O. 1C-7A-1; T.O. 1C-7A-2; tests given at the CCTS; wing and squadron histories; and general knowledge from the 60's and 70's (news, celebrities, music, TV, films). In 2015, the **535**th TAS won the fourth Caribou Bowl.
