## C-7A Caribou Association's 28<sup>th</sup> Reunion DoubleTree Reid Park, Tucson, AZ September 13<sup>th</sup> – 17<sup>th</sup>, 2017

**Place**: DoubleTree Reid Park will be the headquarters for Reunion 2017.

Surrounded by the Sonora Desert and set on 14 acres of lushly landscaped grounds, the DoubleTree has spacious, smoke-free rooms. Upon arrival, you will receive a warm chocolate chip cookie as a welcome gift.

The hotel is four miles from downtown Tucson and across the street from Reid Park which features a zoo, 25 tennis courts, and two professional quality golf courses.

Parking is free. Valet parking is not available.

Room amenities include: Free highspeed internet access, in-room safe, coffee maker, mini-refrigerator, cable TV with 42 inch flat screen, work space, hair dryer, iron, and board. Many rooms offer patios overlooking the citrus tree-lined courtyard or the spectacular mountain views.

DoubleTree Reid Park has a business center, a 24 hour fitness center, a heated outdoor pool and whirlpool, and three tennis courts.

Pets and Service Dogs (50 pound maximum weight) are welcome, but a non-refundable \$50 deposit is required.

Local Transportation. The hotel provides complimentary shuttle service within a three mile radius.

#### **Hotel Reservations:**

Make hotel reservations by calling 800-222-8733. Tell them you are with the C-7A Caribou Association. Cut-off date for reserving rooms at our rate is 10 August 2017.

Single or double @ \$ 99.24

Our group rate is good from 10-20 September and includes taxes and daily, hot All-American breakfast buffet. Mention the *C-7A Caribou Association*.

A 10% discount is offered for the onsite restaurants and gift shop.

**Hotel Check-In**: The check in time is 3:00 PM or later. Unless the hotel is full the night before, some rooms may be available earlier in the afternoon.

**Weather**: Mid-September temperatures range from the mid 70's at night to the high 90's during the day, with only a trace of rain during the month.

#### **Airport Ground Transportation:**

The hotel is seven miles from the Tucson International airport. Taxi fare is \$30. Other options are \$25.

If you are considering flying into Phoenix and then driving to Tucson, it is about a two hour, 115 mile drive. Taxi fare from Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport to the DoubleTree Reid Park is approximately \$100.

**Reunion Registration**: Register for the reunion by mailing your completed form and check made out to the C-7A Caribou Association to Pat Hanavan, 12402 Winding Branch, San Antonio, TX 78230-2770. Upon arrival, pick up your name tag and registration packet

in the War Room

If you do not pre-register, every effort will be made to accommodate last minute arrivals, but we cannot guarantee the availability of an activity due to varying prior-notice requirements.

Reunion check-in is from 1400-2100 in the War Room. For those who arrive later, find the War Room and someone will take care of you. If you arrive before noon, come on in and help us set up!

**Reception**: In the War Room, from 1800-2000 – our usual snacks, supplemented with a few *hors d'oeuvres* from hotel catering.

The reception is not the evening meal. Be considerate of others and take only an appropriate serving of items for yourself to make sure that everyone gets their share.

The **War Room** will be set with tables to sit around and catch up with old acquaintances. It will open at 3:00 PM on 13 September and close at midnight, and then be available from 7:00 AM to midnight on Thursday through Saturday, and from 7:00 AM until 10:00 AM on Sunday.

Exception:

During periods when reunion attendees are away, e.g., tours, the War Room will be closed (locked up) unless an Association volunteer agrees to act as War Room monitor. The Caribou Association – not the hotel – will be responsible for War Room security throughout the reunion.

# Pima Air and Space

The Pima Air and Space Museum is the largest non-government funded aviation museum in the United States. The museum maintains a collection of more than 300 aircraft and spacecraft from around the globe, spread over five hangars and 80 acres. More than 125,000 artifacts are also on display.

Hangar 1 displays include an A-10 Warthog, an SR-71A Blackbird, a USAF "Through the Years" exhibit, and a mock-up of a control tower.

Hangar 2 contains the museum's administrative offices, library, archives, and a small exhibit gallery for the Arizona Aviation Hall of Fame.

Hangars 3 and 4 house much of the museum's collection of World War II aircraft, including the prized B-24J Liberator and the B-29 Super Fortress. The continued growth of the museum's collection required construction of a third building to house World War II era aircraft. Centered around both American and Japanese aircraft recovered from the battlefields of New Guinea, this building gives visitors a detailed look at World War II in the Pacific.

The 390th Bomb Group Memorial Museum, dedicated to the World War II history of the 390th and the B-17, has its own building in the center of the grounds. Run as a completely separate museum by veterans of the 390th Bomb



Group, the building houses a B-17G Flying Fortress, a library, and an extensive collection of artifacts from the members of the 390th Bomb Group.

The Space Gallery houses a comprehensive gallery of exhibits on space exploration. Highlights of the exhibit include a full-size mock-up of the Apollo capsule, a full-size mock-up of the X-15, and a lunar rock sample.



The museum is adjacent to Davis-Monthan AFB. The 309th Aerospace Maintenance and Regeneration Group (AMARG), affiliated with the base, also known as the "Graveyard of Planes" or "The Boneyard", is the largest aircraft storage and preservation facility in the world.

#### **Titan Missile Museum**

This is the only publicly accessible Titan II Missile Complex in existence.

The Titan II was capable of launching from its underground silo in 58 seconds and delivering a 9 Megaton thermonuclear warhead to a target more than 6,300 miles away in less than thirty minutes. Titan II complexes across the United States stood "on alert" 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, for over 20 years. First 25 to register (wait list also).

#### Sonora Museum

The Sonora Desert Museum will change your idea of a museum because 85% of the museum is outdoors. The museum has a fusion zoo, botanical garden, natural history museum, aquarium, and art gallery. The museum is home to more than 230 animal species and 1,200 varieties of plants. There are two miles of walking trails to explore.

Highlights include the hummingbird aviary, Warden Aquarium, and the Earth Sciences Center.
