Packy's Sport Lounge and Restaurant, also on the main floor, will be available for all meals that are not on the agenda. A wide variety of restaurants and fast food places are a ten-minute drive away.

Reservations:

The room block is under "Caribou Association" (\$71.18/night inclusive of taxes). To reserve a room, call (937) 879-2696 or check online at www.hopehotel.com. Be sure to identify yourself with the Association so that you get our special room rate and the Association gets credit for the reservation (our prices are contingent upon meeting certain minimum registration requirements). Please note that hotel reservations are entirely the responsibility of the attendee and not included in any fees paid to the Association.

Hotel Check In:

The normal check in time is 3:00 PM or later, but we are working to try to get that moved up. Unless the hotel is full the night before, some rooms may be available a little earlier.

Weather:

Not even Al Gore can predict what the weather will be like, but it can be chilly at this time of the year. Remember that the dedication ceremony is outdoors so bring warm clothes just in case. The historical averages for our reunion period are highs of 73-70 degrees F, lows of 49-48 degrees and only a slight chance of precipitation (source: WPAFB Wx shop).

Transportation:

By Car:

Aim in the general direction of Dayton and get yourself on Interstate 675 to the east of the city. Depending on whether you are northbound or southbound, you will find the appropriate map and directions in Attachment 1.

By Commercial Air:

Dayton International Airport is north of Dayton. The Hope Hotel is southeast of the airport on Hwy 444 just outside of WPAFB Gate 12A. The drive from the airport is 16 to 24 miles depending on the route you choose. Since you probably don't want to walk, there are several options available:

Reunion Registration:

We request advance registration with your prepayment by check for all selected events no later than 1 August 2008. Upon arrival you will then only have to pick up your nametag and registration package. If you do not pre-register, every effort will be made to accommodate last minute arrivals but we cannot guarantee the availability of every event due to varying prior-notice requirements for transportation, security checks to drive on base and for 72 hour advance meal counts. Please note that if you sign up and subsequently cancel for some reason, your payment will be returned except for the registration fee (\$20 per person).

Registration will take place from noon to 4:00 PM on 29 September in the hotel lobby. For those who will not be arriving in that time period, just seek out the War Room and someone will take care of you. If you arrive before noon, come on in and help with War Room setup!

War Room:

The War Room is large and will accommodate 300 people. It will be outfitted with tables to sit around and catch up with old acquaintances. It will open at noon on 29 September, closing at 11:00 PM, and then be available from 7:00 AM to 11:00 PM on 30 September through 2 October and from 7:00 AM until noon on 3 October. Exception: During periods when reunion attendees are away at "off-campus" events, e.g., tours, memorial dedication, museum banquet, the War Room will be closed (locked up) unless an Association volunteer agrees to act as War Room monitor. On 30 September through 3 October, a Continental Breakfast of coffee, Danish, and assorted juices will be served. The Caribou Association – not the Hope Hotel - will be responsible for War Room security throughout the reunion.

After lunch (included), tour Wright Brothers Interpretive Center, the Wright Brothers Memorial and Huffman Prairie, the world's first airport, in all, a primer on the Wright Brothers" contribution to flight that you'll see no where else.

 The Museum is 4.8 miles from Hope Hotel and open from 9 AM to 5 PM. There will also be free shuttle bus service available during museum hours.

 Board bus at Hope Hotel for tour of museum's restoration area. **Tour limited to first 100 members who register**. See ongoing restoration of Memphis Belle, first B-17 to complete 25 missions in WW
 II. Photo ID required. Please note that it took some serious arm-twisting to get this much of a concession on the restoration tour and we are working hard to see if there is any way they can accommodate more people. If not, please try to understand that this is a special event set up specifically for us and the resources for this sort of tour at the museum are limited. If this is something you wish to do, just be the first person to sign up and you are all set! Additional information about the limitations of this tour is included in Attachment 3.

 Museum is 4.8 miles from Hope Hotel and open from 9 AM to 5 PM. There will also be free shuttle bus service available during museum hours.

- 12. Thu 10/2 Reunion Banquet at Museum (6-10pm) \$40 pp. (optional)



The Limitations of the Restoration Tour

Pat Hanavan has offered the following description of the issues involved in the restoration area tour.

From the museum's website:

Behind the Scenes Tours

Behind the Scenes Tours are regularly scheduled, free guided tours of the museum's restoration area. The museum shuttle bus transports participants to the restoration hangars, located on the historic Wright Field flight line in Area B of Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, about one mile from the main museum complex.

Participants must be at least 12 years old, and an adult must accompany those between 12 and 18. A current government-issued photo ID (i.e. driver's license) is required of all individuals 18 and over. Foreign visitors must present an original passport. For security reasons, all bags are subject to search, and backpacks, packages and large camera cases are not permitted on the shuttle bus.

Shuttle buses are not handicapped accessible. Individuals requiring special assistance should contact the museum's Education Division at least one week in advance at (937) 255-4652 to arrange transportation.

Behind the Scenes Tours are offered every Friday (some exceptions) at 12:15 p.m. Advanced registration is required, and registrations are currently being taken for tours through May 2008. Sign up early as tours may fill up quickly! Registration closes the Wednesday before the tour; however, a limited number of "walk-in" registrations are available on the day of the tour. No group reservations are accepted.

Pat's Amplification of our tour:

Ours is a special two hour tour (Wednesday morning rather than Friday afternoon) approved by the museum director, MG Metcalf, as a result of a special request the Board, got General Jumper to make on our behalf. Only one tour is done each week and the number of participants is limited because it is led by a tour guide or restorer who explains to a small group (6-10 people) what is being done on the various aircraft being prepared for display in the museum proper. The tour location consists of 2 restoration hangars (industrial areas) that were the modification facilities for the Directorate of Flight Test of Aeronautical Systems Division. I was a test pilot there from in 1966-1967 and spent many hours in those hangars reviewing and approving drawings and modifications to our test aircraft.
