#### C-7A Caribou Association's 24<sup>th</sup> Reunion DoubleTree Suites (206-575-8220) Seattle, WA 98188 October 9<sup>th</sup> – 13<sup>th</sup>, 2013

**Place**: The DoubleTree Suites, 16500 Southcenter Pkwy, Seattle, WA 98188 will be headquarters for Reunion 2013. The hotel has 219 rooms, free high-speed internet access, free guest parking, and space for parking of RVs. Every room is a two-room **suite** with living room/ parlor, pull-out sofa bed, phone, coffee maker, refrigerator, and TV.

Hotel Reservations: Group room rate is \$111.28 (includes taxes). Call 206-575-8220. Group code is "C7A" when making your reservation. To get the group rate, your reservation must be made by 9/18/13. Hotel reservations are your responsibility and are not included in any fees paid with reunion registration. Rate is good from 6-15 Oct.

**Hotel Check-In**: The check in time is 3:00 PM or later. Unless the hotel is full the night before, some rooms may be available a little earlier in the afternoon.

Weather: Early October temperatures are in the mid to high 50's with 3.3 inches of rain during the month.

#### Transportation:

By Car: The hotel is 4 miles from Seattle-Tacoma Airport, on Southcenter Parkway, just east of IH 5.

By Commercial Air: The hotel provides complimentary airport shuttle service runs between 6:00 AM and 11:00 PM. Call the hotel when you arrive at the waiting areas at Island # 1 or Island # 3 **only**, located one floor above baggage claim. Cross over the sky bridge, go down one floor to floor # 3. Call the hotel from the island. Return shuttle to the airport can be scheduled with front desk.

The Association will provide bus transportation for three off-site tours (Museum of Flight, City Tour for the ladies, and tour of Boeing plant).

**Reunion Registration**: Register for the reunion by mailing your completed form and check made out to the C-7A Caribou Association to Pat Hanavan, 12402 Winding Branch, San Antonio, TX 78230-2770. Upon arrival, pick up your name tag and registration packet in the War Room.

If you do not pre-register, every effort will be made to accommodate last minute arrivals, but we cannot guarantee the availability of an event due to varying prior-notice requirements. Reunion check-in is from 1400-2100 in the War Room. For those who arrive later, find the War Room and someone will take care of you. If you arrive before noon, come on in and help us set up!

**Reception**: In the War Room, from 1800-2000. Our usual snacks, supplemented with a few other items.

The **War Room** will be set with tables to sit around and catch up with old acquaintances. It will open at 3:00 PM on 9 October and close at midnight, and then be available from 7:00 AM to midnight on Wed. through Sat. and from 7:00 AM until

10:00 AM on Sunday.

Exception:

During periods when reunion attendees are away, e.g., tours, the War Room will be closed (locked up) unless an Association volunteer agrees to act as War Room monitor. The Caribou Association – not the hotel – will be responsible for War Room security throughout the reunion.

**Shopping**: The hotel is across the street from Southcenter/Westfield Shopping Center where there are more than **140 stores**. In the Center or nearby are over **50 restaurants**, banks, a theatre, and many other services and amenities.

**Pool and health club**: The hotel has complimentary indoor pool and health club facilities for guests to exercise, relax and unwind. In addition to the Swimming Pool and Health Club Facilities and Equipment, the hotel also offers two Racquetball Courts, a Sauna, and a Spa Tub.

#### **Museum of Flight**

On Thursday, 10 October, we will go by chartered bus to the Museum of Flight for a private docent tour. This museum is one of the best in the country. It holds one of the largest and most comprehensive air and space collections in the United States, rare photographs and negatives, a world-class library, tens of thousands of artifacts, and over 150 rare aircraft and space vehicles.

Aircraft holdings include: Boeing 80A, B-17F, B-29, B-52G, VC-137B, WB-47E, Canadair CL-13B Sabre, Concorde, P-40N, D.H. 106 Comet 4C, A-4F, DC-2, DC-3, Fiat G-91, V-1, Fokker D.VII and D.VIII reproductions, Super Corsair, A-6E, F-14A, F-9F8, Lear Fan 2100, Learjet 23, Super Constellation, D-21B drone, F-104C, RQ-3A Dark Star, AV-8C, F-4C, BF-109E, Mig 15, Mig 17, Mig 19, Mig 21, Nieuport 28, P-51D, YF-5A, H-21B, P-47D, Rutan Voyager, HH-53, Sopwith Camel reproduction, Spad XIII reproduction, PT-13A, Spitfire Mk.IX, Taylor Aerocar III, XF-8U-1, and Yak 9U. Apollo Command Module 007A, various Apollo engineering mockups, Space Station Laboratory mock-up, and Soyuz descent module.

#### **Boeing Plant Tour**

On Friday, 11 October, we will go by chartered bus to tour the Boeing factory in Mukilteo, WA, 25 miles north of Seattle. The facility is home to the 747, 767, 777 and 787 Dreamliner production lines.

During the tour of the world's largest building by volume (472,000,000 cubic feet or 13,385,378 cubic meters), visitors see airplanes being built for Boeing's worldwide base of airline customers.

The tour lasts 90 minutes. No still photos or video cameras are allowed on the tour. We will view the aircraft being assembled from tour balconies above the production line floor. The 787 line is fascinating – the aircraft being assembled travel along the assembly line just like an automobile production line.

#### **Friday Buffet**

At the Friday buffet, Trish Beckman, a Vietnam veteran, will speak about her experience as a flight test engineer at Edwards AFB and a flight test navigator for Boeing.

Before the Friday buffet, Phillip Jennings, a Marine veteran and CIA pilot, will share his experiences of the Vietnam War. He is the author of *The Politically Incorrect Guide to the Vietnam War*. He will have signed copies of his book for sale.
